## Haskap picking

Bibai's Haskap boasts the highest yield in Japan.

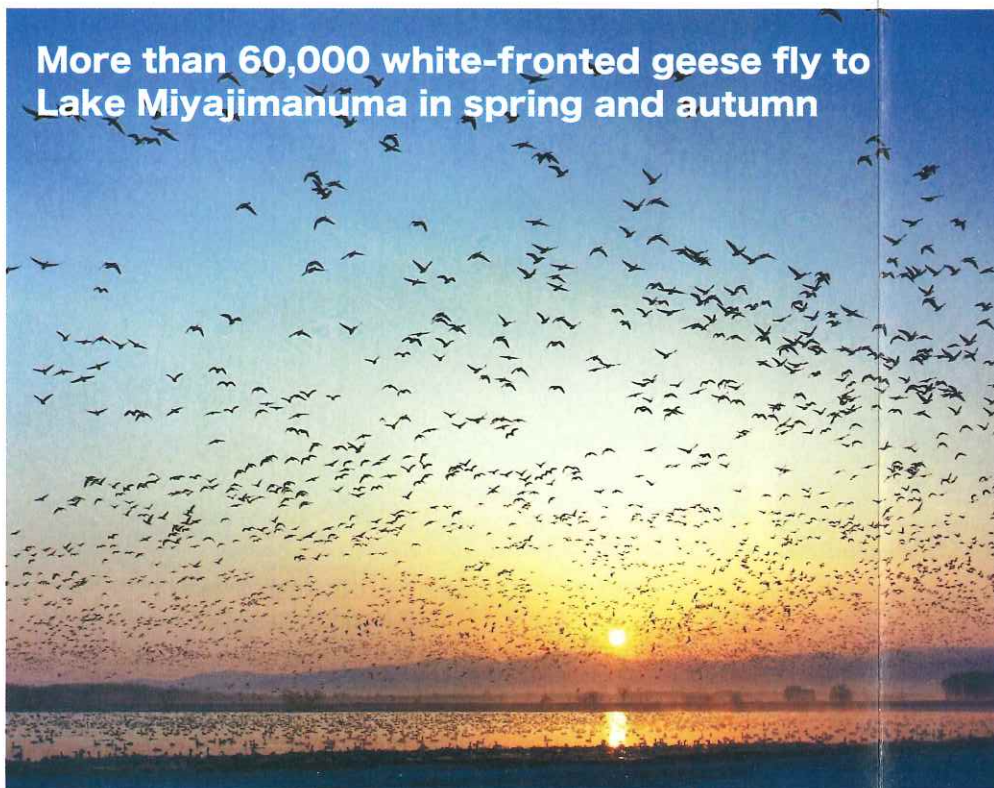
You can enjoy haskap picking at seven farms from late June to mid-July. Haskap is called the elixir of life by the Ainu people.

It is rich in vitamins, calcium, and iron. It prevents anemia, cold sensitivity, eye strain, and skin blemishes.

Bibai's haskap is processed into various products such as fruit juice and jam.

## Lake Miyajimanuma. A Wetland Designated under the Ramsar Convention

Lake Miyajimanuma is located in the western part of Bibai. The Ishikari River flows through the western side of the wetlands, while fertile rice paddies stretch out all around, as far as the eye can see.



Approximately 25 hectares in area and this shallow, modest wetland is a precious stopover for migratory birds such as greater white-fronted geese, swans, and other birds in the duck family. Due to its unique natural environment, Lake Miyajimanuma was registered as a Wetland of International Importance under the Ramsar Convention in 2002.

More than 60,000 white-fronted geese fly to Lake Miyajimanuma in spring and autumn; it's also a place of choice for spending winter in Japan. This is thought to be because of urban development leading to decreasing migrating grounds. Lake Miyajimanuma's surrounding rice paddies, make it easier to spot predators, and there is an abundance of food for the geese.

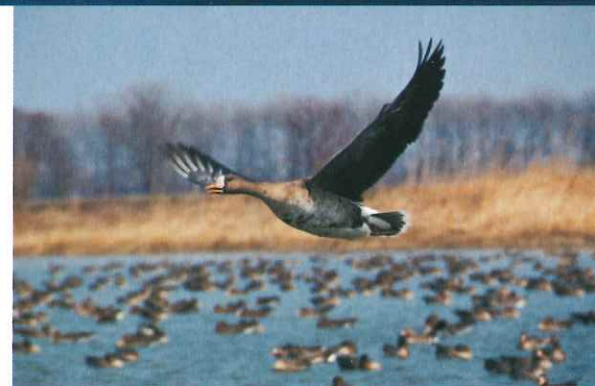

## Famous Bibai yakitori

Bibai has been rooted in the food culture of "mustn't waste food." For this reason, Bibai yakitori uses various parts such as liver, hearts, eggs, yolks, and skin to make "motsu skewers". In addition to its use of onions, it is grilled over charcoal and seasonings add salt and pepper. The taste that once healed the fatigue of coal miners is still loved as a taste of hometown.

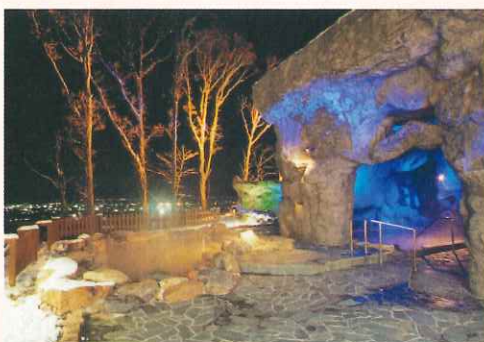


**Bibai's Tomei Park is the northernmost Somei-Yoshino cherries blooming in Japan. Beautiful flowers signal the coming of spring.**

This park is famous throughout the Sorachi subprefecture for its abundance of 2,000 decorative cherry trees, and 5,000 azaleas.

You can take in a breathtaking panoramic view of the flowers from an observatory in the middle of a hilly area of the park, about 4km east of the National Highway Route 12.

Moreover, there are many fun places such as Yuurinkan, a park golf course, and a hands-on ceramic facility.

This open-air bath is reminiscent of a blue grotto. You can overlook the Sorachi plains and Mt Pinneshiri.
